This is a significant community, illustrated by the 700+ responses that we received from an initial survey to test peoples experiences and issues.

Our scheme is about a win, win situation for both consumers and local businesses, recognising our significant service community, giving thanks for their service by offering this scheme which in turn benefits local businesses helping to sustain our struggling town centres and bring them new customers. Additionally our scheme is about community integration, and networks, encouraging serving personnel and veterans to trade locally, utilise independents and by doing so spend time in our local towns rather than heading off to larger shopping malls and cities.

This discount card allows Veterans and the Armed Forces Community to have a card that can allow them to receive military discounts.

The South Kesteven Armed Forces Discount Scheme is being set up to support our local armed forces community; serving personnel, reservists, veterans and war widows who live in the South Kesteven district.

My name is Mr Nigel Garry. I am a registered Blind person and am Volunteer Chairman of North Wales Accessible Holidays for Blind and Visually Impaired. Our organisation are now the proud owners of a 14ft X 42ft Beaumont 6 berth static caravan [I would like to emphasise that bed 5&6 is pull out from settee] located at 9 Harlech Court, Lyons Lido Beach Holiday Park, Bastion Road, Prestatyn North Wales LL19 7EU. In addition to our flagship caravan due to demand outstripping supply it now gives me great pleasure to inform you of our second fully adapted and accessible caravan which is a 12ft X 40ft Windemere 6 berth [Bed 5 & 6 is pull out from settee] located at 90 Chestnut Gardens Lyons Robin Hood Holiday Park Coast Road Rhyl North Wales LL18 3UU.

These caravans are for the use of beneficiaries who are registered blind or partially sighted, to include family, carers and friends.

They have ramp access plus any other conceivable pieces of equipment to ensure our client group have a safe and comfortable holiday. Our facilities are to such a high standard that the only additional luggage you will need is your own personal towels. [The caravans are self catering] Tariffs are £200 Oct to end April & £250 May to end of September per week to help us with maintenance, replacement of invaluable equipment and ground rent. I am sure you will agree these are nominal tariffs that carry a subsidy of between £600 & £650 per week.

'Be My Eyes' – phone app allows volunteers to be eyes of visually impaired.

Be My Eyes, the award-winning app that has eased the lives of 113,000 blind people in 150 countries, is so successful it has more volunteers than it knows what to do with!

The idea is simple: a blind or visually impaired person needs help with a task. They make a live video call to a sighted volunteer, who can tell them if the milk has expired, check the label on their medication or help them find the cash they have dropped on the floor.

A number of volunteers are contacted at once in case people are busy. In addition, because there are volunteers in many time zones, there will almost certainly be someone to assist a user, even in the middle of the night.

‘Tasks that the app has been able to help with have ranged from guiding someone out of a tunnel to checking a bride’s gown before she walked down the aisle.’

Tips & Tricks from our readers!

Money

If going shopping cut down on the number of coins taken. For example, just take 50p, £1 and £2 coins that are readily identified by feel (shape & size).

As for 'paper' money there are three common notes of £5, £10 and £20 denominations.

The £5 and £10 are now both made from a polymer material and are easy to distinguish from the paper £20 note by feel. The £5 note is the smaller of the polymer notes and the £10 note has two clusters of raised dots in the top left hand corner.

The new polymer £20 note is released on 20th February 2020 and will have tactile identification. On the front of the note which has raised print there will be three clusters of raised dots in the top left hand corner.

Postage Stamps

Books of postage stamps have the back page slightly longer than the front page, they also have a small indentation at the top of the back page. If there is one indentation then the book has first class stamps in it, if there are two indentations then the book has second class stamps in it.

New Year, New Date – Top Tip

As our new year is 2020 people are being warned about writing the complete year date on cheques and documents. In previous years many of us would have written the date as 01/01/19 which was safe but if we start to write the new year date as 01/01/20 it leaves an opportunity for anyone to add previous year dates on the end to make 01/01/2018/19. The advice being given is to always write the new year date as 01/01/2020 so nothing can be added at the end and all cheques and documents will be secure with the correct current date.
